Nike gives to local schools

CHARITABLE GIVING

The **Nike School Innovation Fund** gave a \$159,000 grant to the Beaverton school district to support its early learning summer academy, **The Leap Start** program. Over the past five years the Nike School Innovation Fund has donated some \$550,000 to the Beaverton program. The fund also gave a \$96,476 grant to the Hillsboro school district to support the 2011 **Early Learning Summer Academy**. Over the past five years the fund has contributed some \$471,500 to the Hillsboro program.

Coca-Cola and the **Portland Timbers** partnered to donate \$50,000 to the **Portland Bureau of Transportation's Safe Routes to School** program. The funds will go toward enhancing efforts to teach students how to safely navigate their neighborhoods on foot or by bicycle. It's part of an effort to promote a cleaner environment and encourage kids to become more active.

Oregon Restaurant & Lodging Association's Education Foundation, in conjunction with the National Restaurant Association Education Foundation, awarded **Lorin Howell** from Roseburg High School and **Amber Holten** from Sprague High School each a \$5,000 scholarship to continue studies at post-secondary culinary arts schools in the Northwest.

The **Wal-Mart Foundation** donated \$50,000 to the **Freshwater Trust**, a Portland-based water

conservation nonprofit, to help further develop its Web-based platform **StreamBank**, used with the permitting and funding process for stream and river restoration.

The award is presented each year to an attorney in recognition of passionate and unwavering commitment to excellence in advocacy for children who have suffered traumatic injuries at birth.
